

NOTICE OF IMPORTANT CLEANUP DOCUMENT COMING SOON:

Fort Ord Munitions Response Remedial Investigation / Feasibility Study Work Plan–Remaining Areas

BACKGROUND: Since the Army initiated the basewide Munitions Response Remedial Investigation / Feasibility Study (RI/FS) program in 1998, thousands of acres of the former Fort Ord land has been evaluated and several Records of Decision have been completed under the Superfund cleanup program at the former Fort Ord. The associated Superfund documentation may be incomplete so a Work Plan to outline the approach for investigating and preparing the Superfund documentation is necessary to identify the final remedy for the remaining areas within the former Fort Ord. Munitions and Explosives of Concern-related field investigations, sampling, and removal activities were conducted within the remaining RI/FS areas by the Army's munitions response contractors according to contractual and/or work plan requirements in place at the time the work was conducted. A review of this data from previous investigations is a part of this evaluation process. The remaining RI/FS areas include both previously identified Munitions Response Sites (MRSs) and some areas in between existing MRSs. Over 8,000 acres will be investigated including a large portion of the Fort Ord Public Lands managed by Bureau of Land Management.

ABOUT THE REPORT: To complete the evaluation, the remaining RI/FS areas have been divided into nine geographic areas or units. See the reverse side of this fact sheet for a map of these areas. It is possible that based on the evaluation results the boundaries of the areas could change as the evaluation proceeds.

The RI/FS work plan will consist of three volumes as follows:

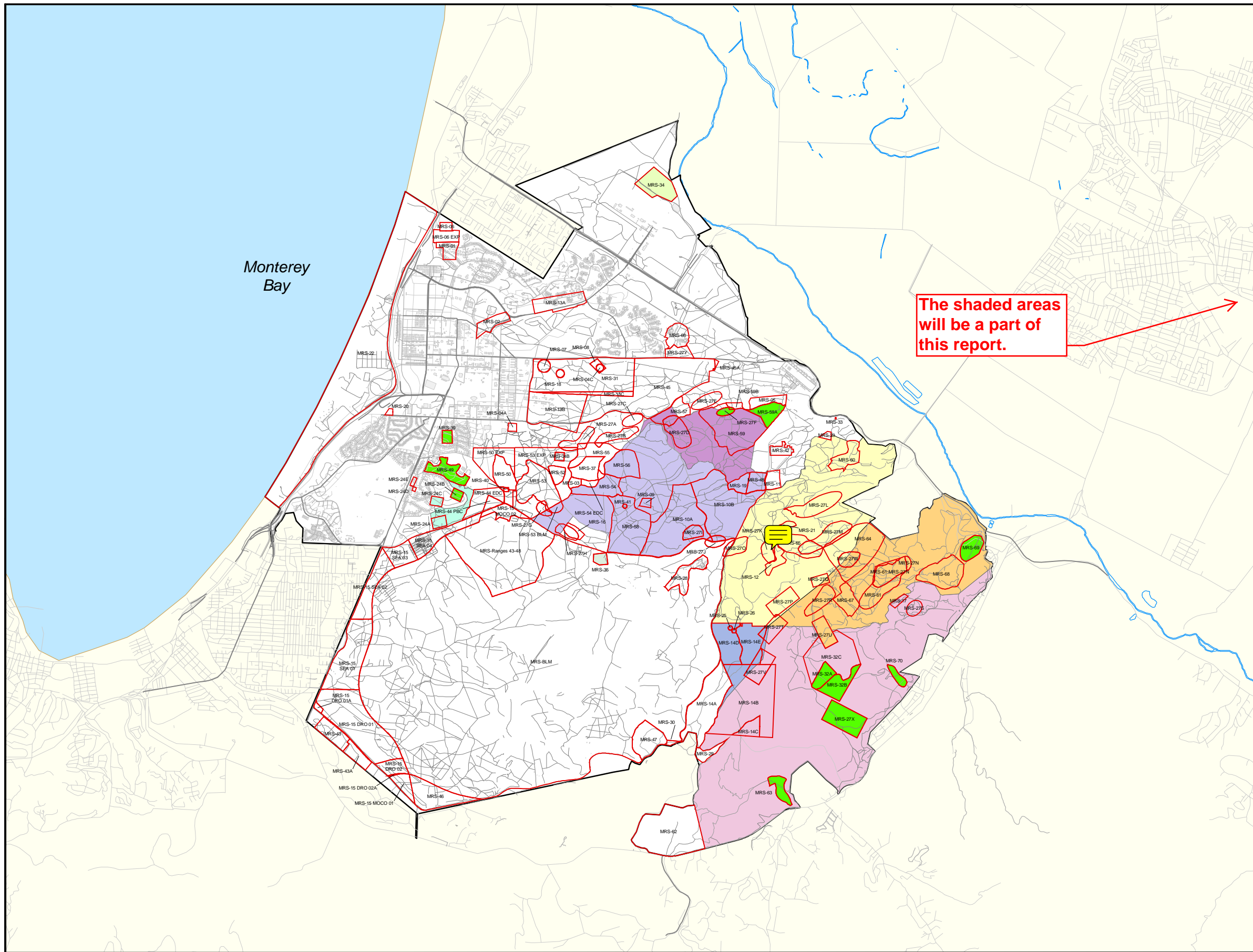
- Volume 1: Data Review and Summary
- Volume 2: Management and Technical Approach Summary
- Volume 3: Technical Procedures.

WHEN TO EXPECT THE REPORT: The draft work plan is scheduled to be released for public and regulatory agency review in late February 2009.

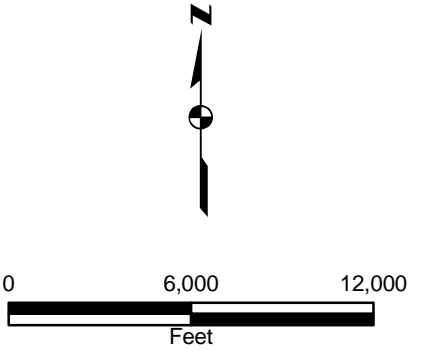
