Area Location Nomenclature

Newly Excessed Lands	Areas being disposed of by the Army as a result of POM Annex downsizing (Army's proposed action). These areas are labeled as parcels 1, 3, 4, and 5.
Parcel	Identified by the BRAC Office, parcels 1, 3, 4, and 5 refer to the newly excessed lands being disposed of as a result of POM Annex downsizing (Army's proposed action). Parcel 2 represents the existing golf courses. This term is not exclusive to this definition.
Polygon	Polygons represent the proposed reuse areas of land in the reuse alternatives. The polygons have been labeled with numbers and proposed land uses.
Revised Use Areas	For Alternative 7, reuse areas that, as agreed to by the Army in the ROD, require additional analysis to cover disposal for new land uses, represent land use changes, or that were not fully covered in the final EIS and ROD. These areas are specified with letters for discussion purposes. For Revised Alternative 7, revised use areas include parcels with proposed land uses that may not have been analyzed previously for that location or that may differ substantially from those under Alternative 7.
Sites	Sites generally refer to the hazardous and toxic waste sites identified in the Basewide Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study. These sites have been numbered and are shown in Figure 4-3. This term is not exclusive to this definition.
