PUBLIC NOTICE

Approval Memorandum - No munitions response needed for 512 acres (Track 0, Group C) at the Former Fort Ord

The 24 Group C areas (approximately 512 acres) at the former Fort Ord were identified as Track 0 areas after the Track 0 Record of Decision was signed. Track 0 areas are those that contain no evidence of munitions and explosives of concern and are not suspected as having been used for munitions-related activities of any kind. Incidental munitions items were found in some of the 24 areas being designated Track 0. An explanation of significant differences (ESD) clarified that discoveries of incidental munitions items that are not indicative of past military munitions training activities does not disqualify an area from being considered for Track 0. Consistent with the Track 0 plug-in process, Track 0 Plug-in Approval Memorandum Selected Parcels - Group C was made available for a 30-day public review period that ended on June 6, 2005. The Approval Memorandum contains the rationales for designating these areas as Track 0 and that no munitions response is needed. The Approval Memorandum was finalized on July 1, 2005.

The Army received written concurrence from U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The State of California, Department of Toxic Substances Control had an opportunity to review and comment and its concerns were addressed. This regulatory agency-approved Approval Memorandum serves as the final decision document regarding munitions response for the
